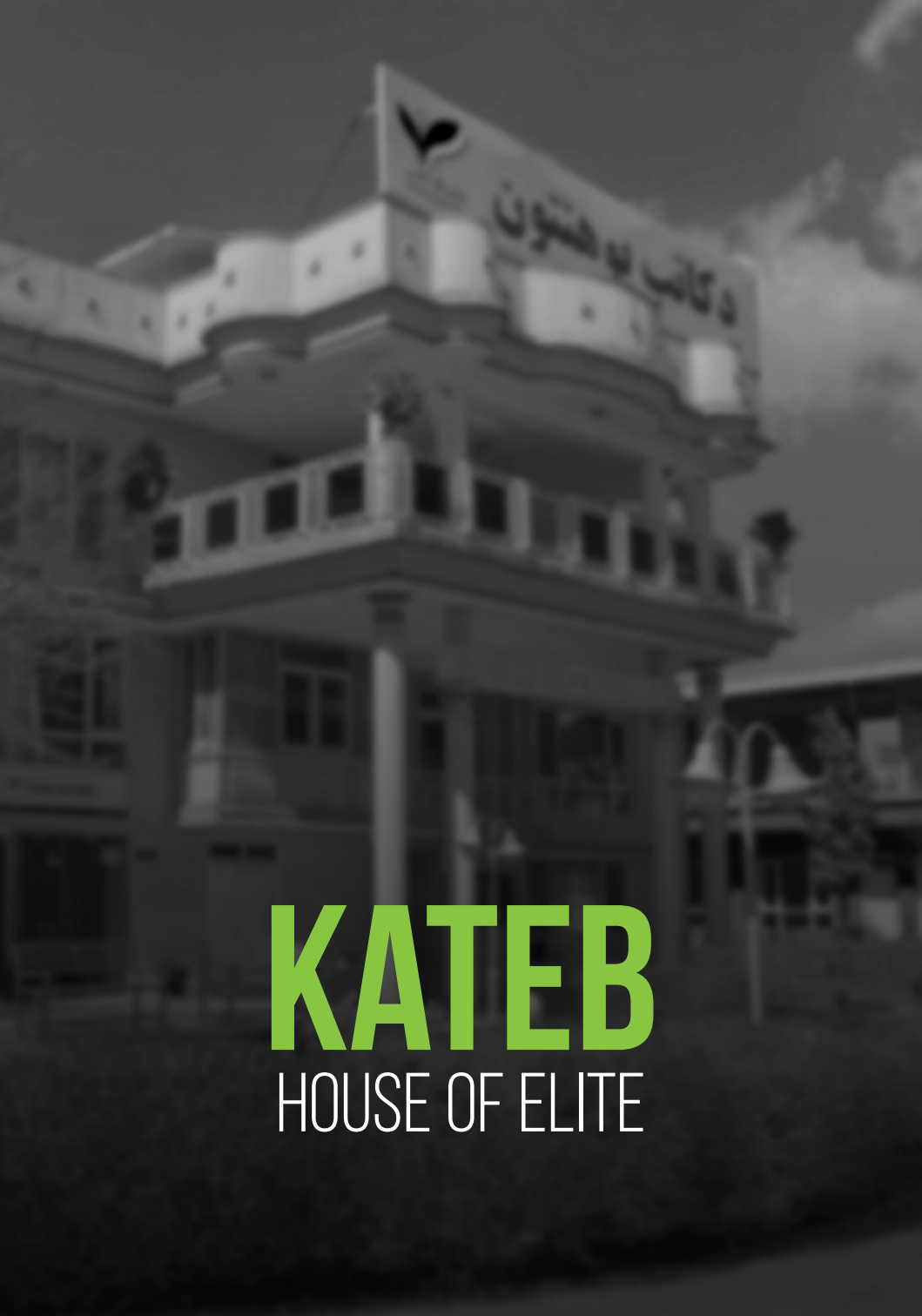

RECENT DEVELOPMENTS

The Department of Law and Political Science has brought remarkable changes to improve the overall trend of higher education and functioning of the faculty and students at Kateb and in Afghanistan as follow:

FACULTY DEVELOPMENT

Department of Law and Political Science has recruited two new professors recently. The first one is Mr. Daud Rezaie who has done his masters in International Water Resource Law. He is a Fulbright PhD candidate at University of Pacific Mc. George Law School J.S.D. The second newly recruited professor is Mr. Abdul Fazl Fasihi who is also a PhD candidate in Political Science in Shahid Behishti University, Iran.

In addition, Law and Political Science Department has two professors who are on their way to achieving their doctoral degrees. This is in continuation of Kateb's mission to either recruit more PhDs as faculty or encourage current professors to pursue their doctoral studies. In the same efforts, Mr. Zamin Ali Habibi has finished his PhD studies from Jamat-ul-Mostafa University, Iran. He is writing his doctoral thesis in Criminology. Mr. Abdul Khaliq Qasimi is also undergoing his PhD studies in Jamat-ul-Mostafa University Iran. He is writing his doctoral thesis in Law.

We have had some quite prominent professors. Kateb University's Department of Law and Political Science had the honor and pleasure of having Dr. Zakia Adeli as faculty member over past few years. Dr. Zakia has recently been hired as Deputy Minister for Social Affairs at Ministry of Justice. Also, Dr. Ahmad Farid Khorosh, current professor for master's degree in Department of Law and Political Science, has been recruited as Cultural Advisor to Second Vice President. It is a great honor to have such personalities as educators at Kateb.

FACULTY PUBLICATIONS

During the past few years, faculty members at Department of Law and Political Science have authored, co-authored and translated many books, some of which are also used as text books for university students across the country. First of all, Mr. Abdul Aziz Noori has co-translated a book titled 'Human Rights and Islam' published by Kateb University Publications. Dr. Abbas Basir who is a visiting faculty member at Department of Law has authored 'Integrated Environmental Management from the Perspective of International Law'. The book was published by Kateb University Publication in 1396. Moving down the list, Dr. Zakia Adeli has written a book on 'Postcolonial Situation and Multiplicity of Afghanistan's Constitutional Law', also published at Kateb University's Publications in 1394. Contributing to the intellectual world, Abdul Khaliq Qasemi, current Dean of Law and Political Science, has written down the second edition of his book on 'Civil Liability Arising from Breach of Contract'. His book was published in Kateb University Publications in 1394. Moreover, Mr. Ghulam Haider Reziae, a visiting faculty at the Department of Law, has authored a book on 'Crimes Against Reputation within Afghanistan's Laws'. Mr. Haider believes that physical harm to somebody is no different from harm to one's reputation because it results in harm to one's psyche and mental health. Therefore, harm to one's reputation should be considered crime with the same attitude as other crimes within society. His book was published in Kateb University Publications in 1394. Last but not the least, Mr. Abdul Aziz Noori, former dean of the department, has written second edition of his book 'Human Rights' in 1394. Mr. Noori has explained in detail origin and history of human rights. He also covers topics on different articles of Universal Declaration of Human Rights. Some of the key issues he covers in his book are; Civil and Political Rights; and Social, Cultural and Economic Rights.



PRACTICAL CAPACITY BUILDING PLATFORMS

The Department of Law and Political Science recently inaugurated Legal Clinic for the purpose of practice of law at Kateb University. This project is funded by USAID. Practice at the legal clinic has led students of law to great heights. Kateb University became champions of 2017 National ICC Moot Court competition.

Between 2015 to 2018, Department of Law and Political Science has organized over 25 guest speakers and conferences. Some of these are; joint conference with Tehran University on Criminal Policy of Iran and Afghanistan about Organized Crime where main presenter was Dr. Ibrahim Shams Baturi; Peace Conversation with Mr. Mia Khel and Ms. Amina Jafari; Right of Women and Youth in Shadow of Political and Social Crisis by parliamentarian Shahgul Rezaie; Review and Evaluation of Electoral Single Member Districts by Mohammad Nayem Ayubzada. In 2017, a team of six law students participated in International Commercial Arbitration held in Kuwait. The participants were Amin Nabizada, Yalda Paiger, Farshid, Abdullah Moradian, Abdul Hussain Ahmadi and Hadi Awhadi.

The goals in five-year strategic plan have been identified as follows:

- Improving the quality and quantity of law education and promoting the Law core values
- Regular equipping and progressive developing of school facilities
- Increasing the vitality and motivation of students and involving them in university activities
- Conducting needs assessment and planning to start e-learning in the university
- Increasing administrative and financial autonomy in the university structure
- Improving the employees' quality of living and tackling their problems
- Expanding interdisciplinary studies of law and other branches of science, especially humanities
- Funding professors' and students' research projects and granting scholarships to talented students
- Making profit through the research projects and other ways
- Attracting at least 250 students per year in all university orientations
- Planning and implementing concrete and effective programs for admitting students of different races and religions and enhancing communication among them with the aim of promoting ethnic and religious tolerance
- Ensuring teaching quality based on international education standards.
- Updating teaching methods continuously and progressively based on international standards.
- Coordinating the law school legal training and research with realities and needs of the country
- Creating Sharia Department for undergraduate level and increasing law department orientation in human rights and international trade for Master studies
- Having 15 faculty members different Law school majors and orientations
- Increasing the Faculty and staff capacity and quality growth and improving their scientific achievements in scientific papers and textbooks compilation
- Expanding the power and authority of the dean of the university and heads of department with regard to the principle of transparency and accountability
- Creating an administrative center for student affairs in the university

DEPARTMENT OVERVIEW

About Law

Faculty of Law was established in 2008 at two Departments of “the judiciary and prosecutors” and “public and private Laws” within the framework of the Kateb University in its central building and began its activities and has continued and conducted its teaching and research programs based on the approved curriculum framework by the Ministry of Higher Education and other laws and regulations and procedures of the Islamic Republic of Afghanistan. In 2011, Faculty of Law established its second branch in the University “Barchi” building in both mentioned departments. The Law School has five graduation periods and more than 600 students have graduated from the university with Bachelor degree. Later, Kateb University’s Master’s program at two majors of “Criminal Law and Criminology” and “international law” were established.

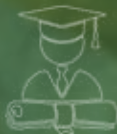
Law School Key Statistics

In 2015, 718 students enrolled in the Law School comprising 28.7% of the total student. In 2016, 120 new students registered in the university. Financially, the Law School comprised %21/89 of total revenue from the students. During the last nine years, the Law school has made significant achievements, the most important of which are as follows:

1. Teaching elite and influential students of the country. Hundreds of these students are serving as judges, prosecutors, attorneys, and government officials, civil and other international institutions employees.
2. publishing 7 law textbooks.
3. publishing 12 research papers.
4. technical and specialized teams entrance such as the “international commercial arbitration” in regional and international competitions.
5. holding more than 12 seminars and scientific conferences.

In terms of organization, the university (School) Scientific Council consists of seven full-time faculty members and more than 40 visiting (adjunct) professors, serving under the Chairmanship of Law School manager and Law School is supervised by the university Teaching Department.

The Law School conducts its Administrative affairs through two office buildings located in Barchi building and university main building. In each office, an expert who is linked with other university departments performs the administrative work. The Law school has 8 classes in the central building and 12 classes in Barchi Center 8 with all educational resources at its access. The students can use all Kateb campus facilities like the library

Law School missions are divided into two sections of “gaining the highest share in the development and promotion of Law and legal norms in the country” and “educating elite law students in the country”

A. Gaining the highest share in the development and promotion of Law and legal norms in the country.

This section is divided into the following sub-categories:

1. Producing the most influential law texts both quantitatively and qualitatively. The texts not only meet the educational needs in the field of law, but also helps in the understanding of the rules and procedures of law at the national and international levels and creates legal doctrine in the country which can be used by judges, prosecutors, lawyers and other law activists.

2. investigating the legal aspects of all political, economic, social, commercial and cultural problems at national and regional levels and offering solutions to solve them.

3. conducting research and holding intensive and specialized programs in various areas of law.

4. recruiting skilled experts and scientific elites as Research and Faculty members

1. Promoting and developing the values of justice and freedom with a focus on gender and racial discrimination elimination, promoting the rule of law, fighting corruption and promoting racial and religious tolerance in the country.

2. Promoting and developing human-centered morality and values and universal human rights and public freedoms.

3. Making profits in order to help achieve financial stability and financial independence of universities.

B. Educating elite law students in the country

This section is divided into the following sub-categories:

1. Educating and training students who are devoted, innovative, responsible and motivated.

2. Educating and training elite students with excellent practical abilities in the field of judgement, prosecution, defense lawyer and legal services in the country. The students gain the necessary practical skills in all branches of law school listed in curriculum.

3. Educating and training elite professionals with the ability to theorize the law. The students will be able to propose ideas in Criminal Law and Criminology, private law, constitutional law, human rights and international commercial law, Islamic law and jurisprudence and other branches of law, in accordance with national and international standards.

4. Educating and training intellectuals. The students will be able to take a critical approach to Law and laws in the country by resorting to the general principles of Law such as justice, and try to reform and develop Law in the country with a different view.

About Political Science

Political Science, since the inception of Kateb University's establishment in 2007, actively and responsibly tried to promote political knowledge in the country. The faculty educated the committed and attentive students with targeted educational and research programs by relying on qualified faculty members. Consistent with the development and promotion of Kateb University in the country and accordingly to the quality improvement criteria of the Ministry of Higher Education, visions of five years (2016 - 2021) of Political Science were prepared and ready to run with the cooperation and consultation of the scientific faculty members. To develop the strategic plan in accordance with the guidelines of the university and faculty leadership, capacity building committee was created at the university and regular meetings (more than forty sessions) were held to prepare and develop the strategic plan.

The capacity building committee of Political Science appreciates the consultation and self-sacrificing efforts of the venerable colleagues, especially Dr. Gholam Hossein Amiri, who helped us in the formulation of strategic plan of the university. In addition, the committee makes this important document available to accept directive comments to improve its effectiveness.

Introduction of Political Science

Political Science at Kateb University has attracted and trained students in two majors; International Relations and Political Thought. The curriculum was determined to meet the needs of Afghan society as well as international standards in four categories including general, basic and special concepts, and optional contents. Students will graduate from undergraduate program if they pass 140 course credits. Since all content of this field is theoretical, teaching method involves lectures, use of slides, projectors, boards and so on. In addition to lectures, research work is done by students as part of the training program. Given the graduates of this major will be working in important decision-making centers of the country such as parliament, ministries, media and etc. In order to become familiar with these institutions, site visits are considered in the semester plans. Political Science enjoys experienced cadre professors who are generally educated at master's or Ph.D. levels.

ACADEMIC PROGRAMS

Undergraduate Program in Law

Undergraduate degree in law from Kateb University opens countless doors of opportunity for its graduates. This degree is offered in two very prominent majors; International Law and Criminology that students can choose from. The study of law is about a system of rules that are created and enforced through social and governmental institutions to regulate behaviors of human beings, ensure societal justice and preserve societal integrity. Afghanistan currently has only around 4,000 registered advocates with Afghanistan Independent Bar Association for a population of over 30 millions. This counts down to just one lawyer for every 7,500 Afghans. This can statistically indicate the scope of an undergraduate degree in law.

There are two majors offered in law undergraduate program. First, BA in Criminology is offered which will give students a broad sight into how societies are affected by crime and criminal behavior. Secondly, we understand the value of rule of law within states and among nations which has significant implications for transactions, trade and regulation. Therefore, second major offered in undergraduate program in law is BA in Public and Private Law. This major teaches students a deep understanding of concepts such as Administrative, Constitutional, Criminal, Municipal and International Law.

Undergraduate Program in Political Science

Politics influences every aspect of a citizen's life including education, employment, healthcare and housing.

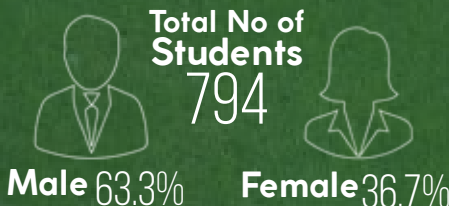
After getting a degree in political science, as a young politician, graduates will make decisions for the betterment of the society by participation in political debates and getting involved in the government. Other ways you can use a political science degree is to join NGOs and support causes to make a difference in the society or candid yourself individually and make your ideas and proposals be heard.

There are many fields of study offered in Political Science; such as, domestic politics, comparative politics, international relations, political theory, public administration and public policy.

Students from the political science department can become members of the Peace and Conflict Resolutions Studies.

Students can either conduct independent research on their own and submit it to the Research Department for review and publication in the Kateb Scientific Research Journal or co-author or assist a professor writing a research article.

Students have three options to choose their majors from at the Political Science Department; Political Science, Political Thoughts and International Relations.

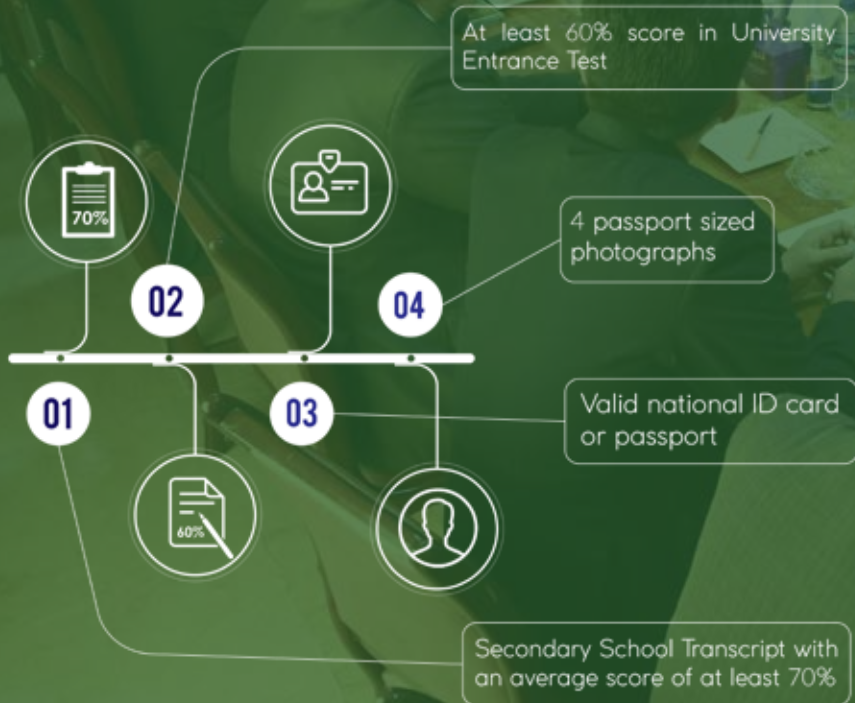

MASTER'S PROGRAM IN LAW

Master's degree in law from Kateb University promises prominent career paths and undeniable success for its graduates. This degree is offered in two very prominent majors; International Law and Criminology that students can choose from.

International law in two categories as 'private international law' and 'public international law' is a set of rules between states and nations that governs the interaction of nations with one another, between citizens and business entities. Graduates with an international law degree can choose from a wide range of careers such as working as international and corporate lawyer, university professor and researcher at international private law firms, the government and international corporations.

Criminology will give students a broad sight into how societies are affected by crime and criminal behavior. There are a variety of professions graduates with a criminology degree can choose to contribute to criminal justice and crime reduction such as the police, prisons, offender management, youth justice and victimization.

MASTER'S PROGRAM IN INTERNATIONAL RELATIONS

Graduating a degree in International Relations is one of the key ways through which you can make the world a better place. You'll have the opportunity to maintain positive diplomatic relations between states, prevent international conflicts, and make sure things run smoothly between governments in our highly interconnected world. But international relation specialists have a much broader set of career options in addition to politics and can get involved in fields like economics, social systems and cultural life of communities. UNDERGRADUATE PROGRAM

BUSINESS ECONOMICS

An undergraduate Business Economics degree provides practical real life solutions to free human societies for their various problems lifting them up from poverty to facilitating them with growth and development. It is expected that taking advantage of the knowledge in economics, graduates learn how to analyze complex economic problems faced by large organizations. The core competencies taught are comprised of theories and applied economics.

Kateb University offers its undergraduate degree in economics over completion of 140 credit. The credit breakdown is; general courses 16 credits, foundation courses 39, core courses 72, electives 7 and thesis is composed of 6 credits. The overall degree is divided into eight semesters and/or four years of study with 18 credits mandatory courses in each regular semester. Each credit hour is equal to 16 sessions per semester. Curriculum at the department of Business Economics is reviewed at the end of each academic year by the Curriculum Development Committee.

BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION

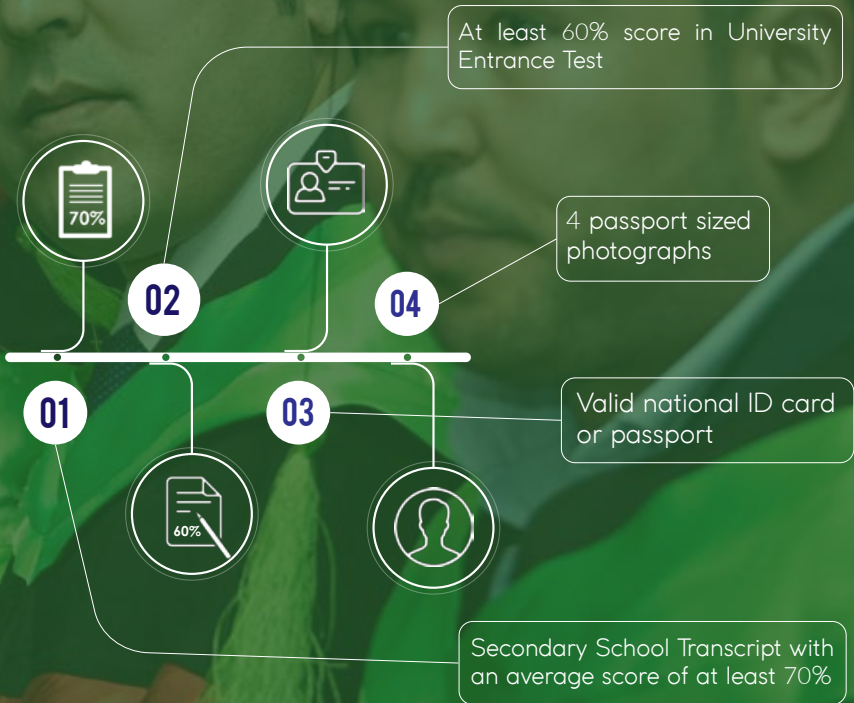
A Bachelor of Business Administration (BBA) is a 4-year degree program which prepares students for a variety of different management and administrative roles in both private and public sector. It emphasizes on the development of communication, quantitative reasoning and business analysis skills. After studying BBA, graduates can opt for a wide range of careers. One may be able to run personal business as a startup in either service or product run businesses.

The educational strategies of the department are a mix of student oriented, teacher oriented and curriculum oriented. Curriculum designed has a total of 140 credit hours. The overall degree is divided into eight semesters and/or four years of study with 18 credits of mandatory courses in each regular semester. Each credit hour is equal to 16 sessions per semester. General courses 16 credits, foundation courses 35, core courses 71, electives 12 and thesis is composed of 6 credit hours.

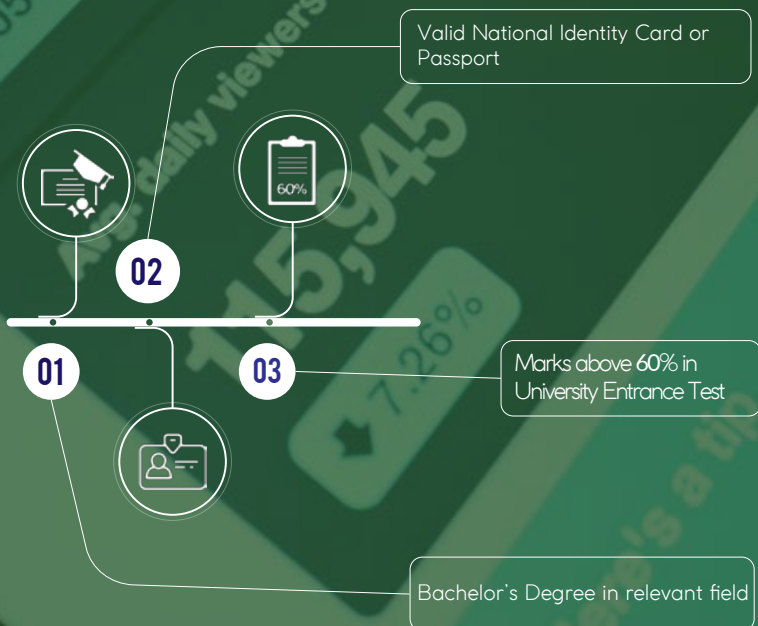

LEARNING FACILITIES

Study of Political Science and Law requires capacities in soft skills. These skills include communication, presentation, argumentation and leadership. In order to equip our students with these skills, we have created platforms that ensures student engagement in extracurricular activities.

LAW CLINIC AND LEGAL COURSEWORK

Identifying the fatal flaw in the legal education system in Afghanistan where students are poorly trained on practical skills such as legal research, writing, and analysis, as well critical thinking. In 2016, Kateb University started to adopt a series of new courses that will provide the much needed practical training for law students. We have brought in some highly qualified instructors to teach practical skills to students. We have come to believe that without providing practical legal training courses such as the legal writing course and the pre-clinic course designed and implemented by the Asia Foundation and/ or the American University of Afghanistan (AUAF), we may not be able to compete in the market in the long term. Therefore, creating a legal clinic and offering a comprehensive legal research and legal writing course have been a top priority for us the in the last few years.

The primary purpose of the legal clinic is to help provide quality legal education and practical skills training opportunity for Law and Sharia Law students. The secondary purpose is providing quality legal aid services for indigent women, and children as well as indigent defendants in criminal cases. Students who are assigned to work at the legal clinics are evaluated by their supervisors and their performances scored based on their evaluation results. As mentioned earlier, the criteria for selecting students is gender-sensitive and we will use all our efforts to ensure gender equality and participation in the clinical education program.

Kateb University Department of Law plans to launch a public awareness campaign through radio and/or TV announcement targeting the specific populations in Kabul province. In addition to the public awareness program, we plan to hire an active defense lawyer with a good reputation among lawyers community as the clinic supervisor who might help in attracting more clients to the legal clinic.

Three of our full time faculty members including the dean of law faculty and head of law department, take the overall responsibility of the legal clinic and participate in any required training courses that will help them lead and manage the clinic in the best way possible. Benefiting from our contacts at the Asia Foundation, we have already started to teach the Foundation's Legal Writing Course to our students as their credit for legal research courses. This course is designed to be offered in two semesters for a total of four credits. In addition, we are preparing to also teach the Foundation's Pre-Clinic Course Manual designed to prepare students of Law and Sharia Law to assist defense lawyers at legal clinics as interns and legal fellows.

ICC MOOT COURT COMPETITION

The International Criminal Moot Court (ICC) national round takes place every year in Kabul, and is organized with the support of the International Criminal Court. Teams of students from all around the country meet to discuss a fictional case where crimes within the jurisdiction of the ICC seem to have been committed. Each team is composed of six members, who play the role of the Prosecutor, the Defense and the Victims' Legal Representative. Each member writes a thirty page or fewer memorial according to assigned role.

The ICC Moot Court is an international competition among universities which simulates the real International Criminal Court. This education and social competition is organized in the city of Hague for a total of 6 days where international students gain skills of a future international lawyer by pretending to be one. An interesting fact about ICC Moot Court is that the final round of the competition is adjudicated by real ICC judges in the ICC Court Room.

The ICC Moot Court is important to us because it teaches students more about the Rome Statute, especially within the countries that have yet to ratify it; such as, Afghanistan. During the competition students argue a hypothetical case to gain better understanding of international criminal law and ICC's mandate and jurisprudence. Moreover, once selected to attend, students get the chance to become familiar with the Hague based international institutions. Our fulltime faculty members work throughout the year to prepare a team for this important event. Along the faculty members, a new team of students is trained for the national, and then, international competition by the team that participated the year before.

In 2016, a team of 10 students, 2 coaches and 8 participants participated in the international ICC moot court.

CENTER FOR HUMAN RIGHTS AT KATEB UNIVERSITY

There is no place on earth today that is not affected by Human Rights phenomenon. Values, politics, culture, law and economies are all affected by this very well-known phenomenon. Using the human rights tools many people around the world have made new demands from their governments, setup revolutionary movements to benefit the best out of their rights as human.

The Center for Human Rights at Kateb University was inaugurated on December fourth of 2013 and like any other Human Rights centers started working for the promotion of Human Rights locally, nationally and regionally through education, research and public awareness.

The center for Human Rights at Kateb University was established for the purpose of producing and expressing ideas for human rights intellectuals and activists to promote human rights values.

First ever journal on Human Rights was also released on December fourth with the inauguration ceremony that discusses the following ideas:

1. Inseparability of the Rule of Law and Human Rights
2. Human Rights and Peace Talks
3. Tolerance
4. Humanitarian Intervention

DEBATE CLUB

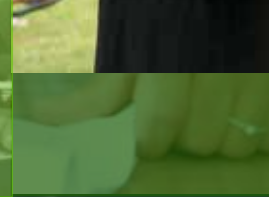
Our Debate Club is a place where participants can learn the art of logical argumentation. Debating is a formal discussion of subjects before a jury or a public assembly. Our debating teams along with their coaches prepare for and attend different tournaments to argue on a specific topics and defend their standing stance. The participants in this club learn about the structure and format of debating. Our coaches are prominent figures who have participated in different debate tournaments at national and international levels. Model debate tournaments are organized on quarterly basis to portray a sense of real debate competition at KPDI. Debating teams from different faculties and KPDI will compete against one another to get the first place. Recently, KPDI has participated in debating tournament organized by Kardan University in which we could defeat our rival teams until semifinals. Having the capacity and talented students, we believe to attain higher places in future debating tournaments.

Kateb Peace and Conflict Resolution Studies Center

Kateb Peace and Conflict Resolution Studies Center aims to study, research and work for Peace Building in Afghanistan. The Peace and Conflict Resolution Studies concept is widely known and appreciated by Universities around the world and is a good opportunity for cooperation among universities. Unlike the past, when only the countries in conflict or arbitrary states were part of the peace building process, today, international organizations and the public play prominent role in peace building process.

Because educational and scientific institutions can play prominent role in peace building, the Political Science Department at Kateb University strives to be part of the activities to enhance the peace building process through national and international organizations and educational institutions.

Organizations such as the High Peace Council is established in the country to enhance the peace building process however these institutions have focused on practical aspects of peace building rather than its theoretical knowledge. To get familiar with the procedures and procedures for enforcing foreign criminal laws and regulations that are exceptionally based on the principle of non-recognition And the validity of foreign criminal sentences in the territory of the country, the researcher, despite the ambiguity of the process of transferring prisoners to Afghan law, established. The Government of Afghanistan has signed agreements on the transfer of detainees to the Russian Federation, the Islamic Republic of Iran and Tajikistan. In this way, the exchange of convicts is imprisoned Countries are subject to conditions (physical and physical). So far, 284 Afghan citizens from Tajikistan and 19 Afghan citizens from Iran have been brought in by the same procedure. On the other hand, 3 people are citizens Tajikistan and 28 Iranian nationals have been transferred to their country for the purpose of implementing and enforcing absenteeism sentences by Afghan courts. Afghan government in transferring convicts to Imprisonment with the countries that have concluded the agreement on the implementation of the extramarital sentences of the foreign country against the Afghan prisoner who transferred the proceedings and transferred to the country's prisons is such that the sentence Extramaritalization in prisons will be imposed on directly displaced prisoners and will not interfere substantially with this criminal judgment, unless this is contrary to the principles and norms of the Afghan legislature, in This will eliminate the vacuum created by the Supreme Court by appealing to the emancipation.
